FROM YOUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR...

It is better to light a candle.....A Profile in Courage

s we approach the Festival of Hanukkah, it is worthwhile to reflect on the power of light and the meaning Athat it brings into our lives.

"G-d said let there be light...G-d saw that the light was good. G-d separated the light from the darkness. G-d called the light Day, and the darkness, He called Night." As it was in the beginning, so it remains today. The

light created by G-d exists in the world and remains the symbol of all that is good.

The story of Hanukkah and the Maccabees remind us that there were also times of darkness as with the desecration of the Temple by Antiochus -- only to be redeemed by the light of the oil found that lasted for eight nights.

The years of the Holocaust and the suppression of Soviet Jewry were also periods of endless night when darkness was present in the world.

Rabbi Dov Lipman, a member of the Israeli Knesset, and his family still use a hanukkiah that reminds them of this dark time in Jewish history—a replica of one constructed of nails in a concentration camp. "It was a gift for my bar mitzvah," says Lipman, a Maryland native who now lives in Beit Shemesh. "As a people we have always used any means at our disposal to survive and to stay strong, and every year when we light this hanukkiah, we and our children are reminded of that."

From the days of the Gulag, a Hanukkah story of courage which lights one of many candles to displace the darkness: Natan Sharansky who walked out of years of imprisonment with the light shining from his face, remembers a time at a Soviet internment camp when a menorah caused a small miracle. Back in 1980, Sharansky was one of a group of political prisoners and the only Jew. "But when I told them Hanukkah was coming, everyone was very enthusiastic," he says.

One friend who worked in the wood shop fashioned a crude menorah of pressed wood from a box for Sharansky. He lit it in the barracks on the first night of Hanukkah and on several subsequent nights, until a KGB collaborator turned him in and the menorah was confiscated. "The head of the camp called me in and told me, 'This is not a synagogue; you were brought here for punishment, not for praying," recalls Sharansky who promptly embarked on a hunger strike.

The hunger strike made the camp leaders nervous because a commission from Moscow was expected to arrive shortly. On the last night of Hanukkah, Sharansky told the head of the camp, "You want me to stop the hunger strike? You give me back my menorah and bring me nine candles. I'll say the prayers and you say, 'Amen."

That is exactly what happened. "I prayed the day would come when we will celebrate our freedom in Jerusalem and that all our enemies will hear our prayer and say, 'Amen," says Sharansky. Since the prayer was in Hebrew, the head of the camp didn't understand a word but just kept saying "Amen." The next day, after the commission had come and gone, Sharansky was sent back to the camp's prison but more light began to penetrate the darkness as a result of that menorah and the courage of Natan Sharansky.

The famous proverb states, "It is better to light a candle than to curse the darkness."

During this Festival of Light, let us follow the faith of Judah and his Macabees and the courage of Natan Sharansky. As we light our own Hanukkiahs, let us rededicate ourselves to bringing light into the world each day through our actions and outreach to all of those who are still living in darkness.

Light our candles and let them shine forth through the darkness.



rvery month it is a challenge to come up with words of wisdom that I can share with all of you. However, this month is different. On October 31, about 300 colleagues from the Greater MetroWest area came together for our annual Early Childhood Conference. Over the years I have been to conferences that I have felt were not enlightening, but this year, I did not feel that way. What I learned from this conference is that early childhood education is changing all the time. As educators our job is to quide, to help children problem solve, to teach children to be kind to one another, to make sure children have self-confidence and feel good about themselves. It's teaching with intent, it's teaching with a real purpose, it's giving the children in our care the tools they will need later on in life. It's teaching a child to be a good person, a critical thinker, a member of a community. Children will learn how to read and write, but we must help them understand what their role is in life. In order to do this, we as educators need to change our focus a bit. Class projects are great if we understand WHY we are doing it. Sometimes just watching a child play with friends helps us have a better understanding of the child and how he/she sees the world.

As a preschool director I struggle with knowing what the right balance is between home and school. I ask myself what are the parents looking for, what are the teachers looking to accomplish and what is the message I want to give as the director.

As parents, we all want our children to be the best at everything they do. As teachers, we try to think of creative ways to teach the children in our care so that the parents can understand what goes on during the course of their children's day when they are with us. For me, as the director, the most important aspect of teaching is to give each and every child the confidence needed as he/she travels through life.

I think we can all agree that children learn best through hands-on experiences. There is an old saying that children learn through play. This is exactly what the Early Childhood Conference reinforced this year. We will continue to encourage our little ones to play, have fun and learn at the same time.






