FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR Sinai – Past, Present, and Future

Ous that the singular event at Sinai, the giving of the law by G-d to Moses and

Israel, was for all those who were there and for those who were not there. In my mind, there are four transcendent events that define us as the people of Israel and provide the impetus and blueprint for how we are to lead our lives as Jews and as members of humankind.

First is creation, when we come into this world as G-d's partners in providing stewardship over all that has been created. At this singular moment we were given the blessing of Shabbat to keep and remember (shamor v'zachor) as we sing in L'cha Dodi during Kabbalat Shabbat prayers on Friday evening.

Second is the liberation from slavery that we celebrate at our Seder tables on Pesach. We pass through the parted waters of the Red Sea—both physically and metaphoricallyand emerge as a people ready to take on the responsibilities that G-d will give to us and prepare to follow his vision for our future.

Third is our encounter with G-d's voice and commandments at Sinai. Even in our fear and trembling, when fire and thunder marked the event in its aftermath, we pledged our fealty and commitment as we responded, "Na'aseh v'nishma" (we will do and we will hear). I will return to this pledge in a moment.

Fourth is the creation of the modern state of Israel now in its 65th year. Just as we emerged through waters of the Red Sea and began our journey as a people in the land of Israel, in 1948 we emerged from the fires of the Holocaust. We as a people began our lives again in our land, the land of our fathers and mothers.

Back now to Sinai and our pledge to listen and to do. Yes, I did reverse the order of the words because it seems more logical. In truth, we did hear G-d at Sinai. Unfortunately, our pledge to do and follow his commandments was abruptly abrogated when our "lack of faith in Moses" returning down the mountain led to the apostasy of the Golden Calf. We Jews are a stubborn lot or "stiff-necked" as Moses would constantly call them throughout the journey in the desert.

The lesson for us, today's generation, and to our children (we were all at Sinai), is to remember our commitment and to redouble our efforts in fulfilling our responsibilities. Those include obeying the laws and strengthening our people and our community.

So on Shavuot 5773, why don't we start our journey begun at Sinai right here at MJCBY.

Get involved, become committed, and in doing so you both enhance your bonds to the people Israel and preserve the heritage and future of your home at MJCBY.

Na'aseh v'Nishma – Let's Do It.
