The Shalom Yeladimers and the Shalom Clubbers and everyone who walked through the door, or called on the phone, he made you feel unique and special and part of our community.

In everything that's light and gay  
I'll always think of you that way  
I'll find you in the morning sun  
And when the night is new  
I'll be looking at the moon  
But I'll be seeing you.*

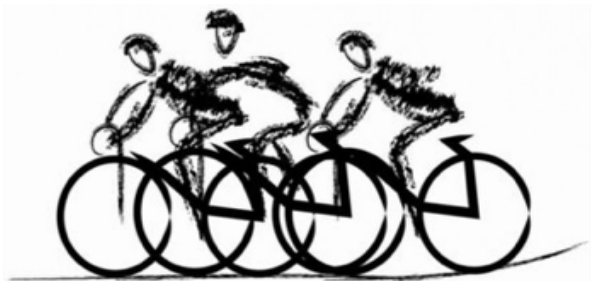

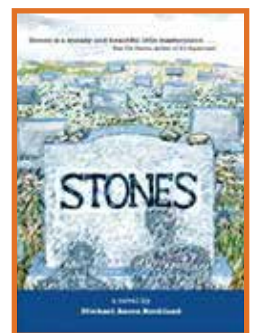

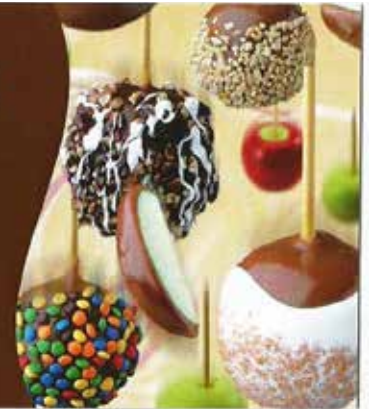
