### FROM THE DESK OF THE RABBI



### A MISSION TO REMEMBER

This past October I had the honor of traveling

to Israel as part of the Greater MetroWest CommUNITY mission to Israel. I have been to Israel many times. I have been to Israel to study, to visit family, to lead congregation tours, for conventions and for conferences. But this mission was unlike anything I have ever experienced. There were more than 470 members of the Greater Metro West community, and about 20 members of our congregation. Many of our congregation were together on Bus 8 (8 is Great!), and some were on other buses. No matter which Bus you were on, the opportunity to be on this Mission provided an amazing experience for everyone.

In the coming months, members of our congregation will be sharing the highlights and special moments they experienced. Ask anyone who went on this mission, and they will tell you that it was the mission of a lifetime. In this article I am the lead off article.

There were two central goals around which this mission was built. First, it was the opportunity to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the modern state. Second, the mission highlighted many of the partnerships, programs and special relationships our community participates in, especially in the South (towns such as Ofakim, Mabuim, Kibbutz Erez and Arad and others.)

From the opening parade in Tel Aviv, to a tour along the security fence, from a

visit to the Israeli Naval Base in Haifa, to our partnership programs in the South, every day was highlight after highlight. I had the unique opportunity to meet with Palestinian leadership in Ramallah and to enter the archives of Yad Vashem. We all made a video of the song, One Day, at Beit Guvrin, and celebrated the pure joy of Shabbat in Jerusalem.

Along with the places we visited were the people we met. Michael Oren and Miri Eisen, Rabbi Lau, MK Isaac Herzog, to name a few. We were witness to the stunning moment when our Federation reunited two lone soldiers with their families from Ukraine!

One of the wonderful honors of this mission was for me to get know many other MetroWest Rabbis, from all different movements. What we shared was our love of Israel and that is the tie that binds

For me, perhaps the most memorable moments were in the opportunity for me to share my knowledge and love of the land and people of Israel with our members and others from Bus 8, along with the new friendships I made, friendships that will last a life time.

There is no more important connection for Jews around the world than the land and people of Israel. I hope to start working on a congregation trip to Israel. If you are interested, please let me know.

t 8 am, on a sunny and warm Friday morning, the entire MetroWest Federation Mission Group (numbering

470) boarded their buses and went to Yad Vashem. Everyone was pre-assigned to a tour. My roommate Eileen Glasser and I were a part of the Architecture Group and had an excellent docent leading us through the new Holocaust History Museum, built by world renowned architect Moshe Sadie. It is 4 times the size of the original historical museum it replaced. The designer of the museum and exhibits is Dorit Harel.

After the tours, the entire mission group assembled at the Jewish Soldiers and Partisan Monument, an amphitheater overlooking the Jerusalem hills. What a privilege to be a part of this wonderful ceremony! Wreaths were dedicated in memory of the fallen soldiers and partisan fighters. We sang Hatikvah. We heard a children's harmonica group play.

Rabbi Lau, now 81 years old, delivered an extraordinary speech about his early life and his brother Naphtali Lavie. (Naphtali Lau-Lavie was an Israeli journalist, author, and diplomat who served as a spokesman for Moshe Dayan, Shimon Peres, and Yitzhak Shamir.) Rabbi Lau brilliantly described many events which shaped his life and led to his devotion and commitment to the state of Israel and to the Jewish people. He spoke for at least 40 minutes to a rapt audience and received a well earned standing ovation at his conclusion.

For me, being at Yad Vashem, having gone through the new museum, hearing Rabbi Lau speak was the most memorable event of an exhilarating week.

Atid means "future" in Hebrew. As Women's League for Conservative Judaism enters its

second century, Torah Fund begins its 77th year, and the State of Israel enters its 71st year. We look forward with joy to our future together with you, our Sisterhood members and supporters of Torah Fund.

Atid usually appears in the phrase "le'atid lavo," which means "in the future to come." This means either the day when the Messiah will come, orolam haba, the afterlife. Israelis, referring to this life, are known to say with optimism, "Yesh atid," which means "there is a future!"

Our Sisterhoods provide the social and educational networks – the extended family – that help us go forward into our future, as Jewish women, with confidence.

The 5779 Torah Fund pin envelopes the Hebrew word for "future" (atid) with a stylized Magen David. It represents our wish for a distinctly Jewish future, for ourselves as individuals, for our families, and our communities.
