

CELEBRATING 120 YEARS!

ow many congregations can boast that they have been of Jewish life for 120 years in the same community? What I can say for sure is that we are one of the very few.

It was in January of 1899 that a dedicated community of a few came together, organized and proclaimed the beginning of a Jewish Center in Morristown.

Over the next several months, we will be celebrating this unique milestone, and I invite you to be a part of it.

Sunday January 13th will be our Kickoff event. On that day we will read from our original charter as well as issue a reproclamation of our congregation. Following a talk by Linda Forgosh, of the Jewish Historical Society of New Jersey, we will unveil the first of an ongoing exhibit of our historical materials. You will be amazed by our history. Each month, over the next several, we will rotate new materials. Thanks so much to Lew Stone, our congregation historian, for his in depth knowledge and know how to help us stage these exhibits.

Our celebration will continue on February 9th with a mid-winter concert, honoring our Legacy donors and our 120th year, with special music that spans our history!

On March 3rd we will celebrate the 90th anniversary of our historic building with a special scavenger hunt for both adults and children. Once again you will be amazed by what we have in our building, hiding in plain site.

April 5th will feature a Shabbat dinner using the menu served at the 1929 dedication, and May 19th will feature a one of a kind closing event and event that you will help us create.

We want you to have a hand in our 120th year events. On January 13th you will have the opportunity to sign up for a number of wide ranging projects that we will work on together. Projects in poetry or music, dance or photography, woodworking, cooking and more.

So, as the new year begins, so does our 120th anniversary. Let's drink L'chaim and sing Shecheyanu...

Heart of my heart....

"Heart of my heart, I love that melody. Heart of my heart, brings back a memory..."

This old barbershop standard composed in 1899 (the same year that MJCBY came into existence) came to mind as I was reflecting on our recent Federation mission to Israel in October.

When you listen to the song you can't help but sing along. It makes you feel warm on a cold day, it makes you smile and maybe even shed a tear.

That is exactly how I feel about my memories of our "Mission of a Lifetime."

We walked thousands of steps and traveled many miles but we did it all together, arm in arm, with one big Heart. We sang, we danced, we ate (boy did we eat), we laughed and we cried all together as one large family.

How could we not but feel warmth in our hearts as we traveled to our Federation sister city of Ofakim in the Negev. We heard the stories of immigrants from many countries, who with the help of our Federation, found new homes in this blossoming city in the desert. I made a connection with one gentlemen from Iran who was settled here two decades ago. We could not speak each other's language but immediately knew each other's hearts. He, Ephraim, and me, Yehuda, hugged each other and laughed under the clear skies of southern Israel. Rabbi Nesson helped explain to him in Hebrew that we were brothers reunited in the land that G-d gave to other father Jacob (Israel).

We cried at Yad Vashem as we heard stories upon stories that touched our hearts. A young woman, Anna Goldberg, from France was deported and sent to camp after camp. We heard her words in letters that eventually made its way to her family. We were shocked, when from the archives, we saw the original order that created the "Final Solution" signed by Himmler.

We sang "Oseh Shalom" as welcomed Shabbat on the southern steps of the temple. We were about 700 together as we joined with our 470 along with members of other Federations.

On our last day we were all gathered at a large park. We heard stories from two lone soldiers from Ukraine and Belarus who had not seen their families for almost three year. The next moment we all paused in awe and then joy as their families appeared (facilitated by our Federation.) This was an experience that none of us will ever forget.

As we traveled our homeland of Israel we made connections with each other and with our extended family all over Israel. We went with our hearts anticipating what we would experience and returned with one big Heart filled with memories that will forever be with us.





Atid means "future" in Hebrew. As Women's League for Conservative Judaism enters its

second century, Torah Fund begins its 77th year, and the State of Israel enters its 71st year. We look forward with joy to our future together with you, our Sisterhood members and supporters of Torah Fund.

Atid usually appears in the phrase "le'atid lavo," which means "in the future to come." This means either the day when the Messiah will come, orolam haba, the afterlife. Israelis, referring to this life, are known to say with optimism, "Yesh atid," which means "there is a future!"

Our Sisterhoods provide the social and educational networks the extended family - that help us go forward into our future, as Jewish women, with confidence.

The 5779 Torah Fund pin envelopes the Hebrew word for "future" (atid) with a stylized Magen David. It represents our wish for a distinctly Jewish future, for ourselves as individuals, for our families, and our communities.


