

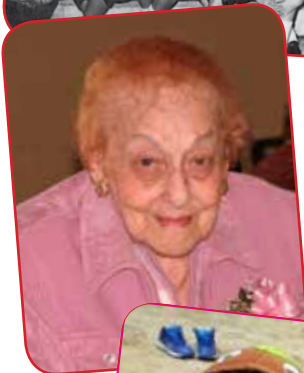

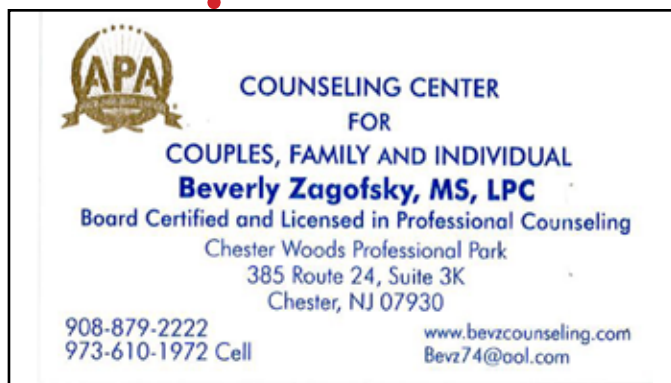

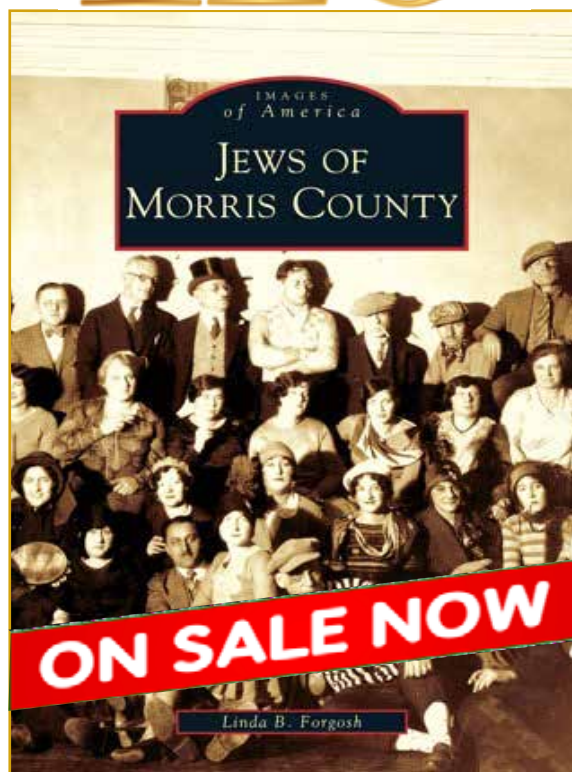

Bus 8 is Great



Irv and I started our Mission trip to Israel early with a visit to my cousin's house in Caesarea. Besides visiting the Old City and eat-

ing in a delicious restaurant by the sea, we visited the Mizgaga Museum. The museum is housed in a structure of the former Mizgaga Glassworks, which produced bottles for the wineries in Zichron Ya'akov and Rishon Le-Zion and was established in 1891 by Baron Rothschild. It closed in 1895 in failure and today exhibits glass art and archaeological artifacts uncovered at Tel Dor and the depths of the sea. We also visited Bat Shlomo, a nearby moshav on the southern slopes of Mount Carmel. The streets were narrow and the café lively and decorated with cows like the lion at MJCBY.

We joined the group Monday evening at the Mega event at the Trask and were heartily welcomed. Tuesday started out with a lecture given by Dr. Michael Oren which was enlightening and informative. Next Dr. Dan Tirza lectured us about the

security fence that he designed and built around the West Bank which we had seen from Kfar Saba, where my cousin also has a condominium.

What truly fascinated us were the catacombs in Bet She'arim. We had no idea that such burial places existed outside of Christianity. There were so many interesting aspects about the catacombs; for example the inscriptions were written in four languages, either Greek, Hebrew, Aramaic, or Palmyrene. Although Aramaic was the common language among Jews, only three inscriptions were found in that language, most were in Greek, the language of many upper class Diaspora Jews. Only the clergy and their families had Hebrew on their tombs.

We visited the IDF Naval base in Haifa. Although my cousin, Hansi, was the commanding officer of the base for several years, we had never been there. This was a very personal experience for us both. Hansi made the Navy his career and fought in all the wars, except for the War of Independence, in which my uncle served. The visit was uplifting.

Although we were definitely the oldest participants we managed to hike and bike on a hill around Jerusalem, on our personal track day. It was a blast! The trip to Ofakim on the nonstop train was unique. We visited three amazing synagogues. We were fascinated by the music and décor, so many colors and jewels, of the Indian synagogue and were surprised by the size of their community. The tour of the Old City of Jerusalem was amazing, we literally walked on biblical land. The archeological excavations showing the physical structures and their enormity was incredible. We walked through history and enjoyed every moment.





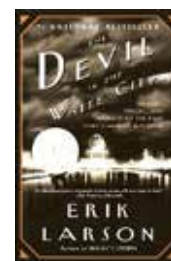
