Our New Director



Shalom Chaverim,

Just a few words to introduce myself to my new congregation. I was born and raised in Bensonhurst, Brooklyn (wasn't everybody?) I went to Hebrew school and gave my valedictory speech in both English and Hebrew (don't ask me now to do it). I graduated from Long Island University – Brooklyn Campus, with a BS in Accounting and MBA in Finance and continued on for my PhD in Management with a concentration in Econometrics, and was appointed Assistant Professor of Business at SUNY Farmingdale, NY. When I realized that I could not support a family on teaching wages, I found work as Director of Accounting at Shell Oil Company in NY. After several years in the business world, I heard that Jewish organizations were looking for individuals to enter the Jewish Communal world and found employment as the Chief Financial and Administrative Officer for both the NY Jewish Community Relations Council and the NY Coalition for Soviet Jewry (not making Russian jewelry). I very much enjoyed working with such notables as former Russian refusenik Natan Sharansky, as well as Elie Weisel (of Blessed memory), and many of the New York "machers", like the Tisch family.

After commuting three hours each day from Princeton to NY, I was asked to become the first Executive Director for the Princeton Jewish Center, working with Rabbi Dov Peretz Elkins (of Chicken Soup for the Jewish Soul) for 2 years, until family tzuris beckoned me to the Jewish mekkah of South Florida. During my 15 years there, I was the Executive Director for several synagogues, including the largest Reform temple south of Washington, DC, Temple Beth El, with a 2,000 member enrollment on a 10.5 acre campus. My wife, Eileen and son Joshua and I returned to the Northeast several years ago, where I became the Executive Director not far from where we reside, just north of Princeton, until arriving here at MJCBY, my home away from home, this February.

I bring to the table a strong background in synagogue life, as well as a love of Judaism, and look forward to meeting with the members, and working with our wonderful and dedicated staff here in Morristown, as we move forward together "from strength to strength".

In Israel No News Is Good News

On the phenomenal Community Mission to Israel organized by the Jewish Federation of MetroWest in October, everyone on Bus 8 shared similar experiences in Israel. As expected, each of us was left with our own personal thoughts and memories. I am frequently asked what my most memorable experience was. My usual and sincere response would be, "Wherever and whatever I am doing at the time." Yet, there is one special day that I would like to share with you, and that was when each of us was given the opportunity to select an activity (from a list) and that became our unique tour. I selected *Reporter for the Day* and was joined with others having the same interest.

As a Reporter for a Day, I was led to believe that there would be a visit to the newsrooms of the International newspaper, The Jerusalem Post, CNN and Al-Jazeera. I was particularly excited about the idea of meeting with the staff of Al Jazeera and was very happy that Gil Hoffman was our professional guide. Gil is the chief political correspondent and analyst for the Jerusalem Post. He has interviewed every major figure in the Israeli political scene and is a regular analyst on CNN, Al-Jazeera and other news outlets. We found out that he is one of the first reporters at the Post to be notified about anything of importance happening in the country. So, about 35 of us boarded the bus at 8:30 AM, and Gil immediately apologized

because there had to be a change in plans: Rockets from Gaza had hit Be'er Sheva early in the morning and all the reporters from The Jerusalem Post, Al-Jazeera and CNN rushed from their offices to Be'er Sheva. Gil informed us that a house was hit, but fortunately, the mother heard the sirens and had just enough time to grab her three little children and run into the safe room in their home. A second terrorist rocket landed in Israel, but not in a populated area. The Israelis won't release where because they don't want to give any information to the terrorists. Gil kept checking his phone and assured us he would keep us informed with any information regarding Israeli retaliation.

We still went to the offices of the newspapers. At The Jerusalem Post, there were a few people at their desks doing editing work, and we just looked around. Gil said that the newspaper was going digital because printed copies were not selling. He asked us to go to The Jerusalem Post site and please subscribe to the digital paper. I'm extending that request to you. CNN allowed us to peek in and at Al-Jazeera, we were refused admittance. When we reboarded our bus, Gil told us that Israel did retaliate. The Israel Air Force fighters hit 20 terrorist tunnels, a tunnel weapons workshop and an underwater terror tunnel. Gil's comment was that Israel was not going to let the chance slip by to destroy what needed to be taken out.

Our next stop was in the Old City at

Robinson's Plaza by the Kotel. Several years ago, when I was there, we were able to walk in an area where the original stones fell from the destruction of the Second Temple and hold egalitarian prayer services there. The area was now closed off because it had always been designated as an archeological site. A large platform was built above the archeological dig. Originally, the platform was built as an egalitarian prayer space but today, it is primarily used for daily minyan by yeshuva buchas. It is used for lectures as well. There are plans to build another area near there for egalitarian prayer.

Our next stop was at the Knesset, and we later met up with the entire mission at Ammunition Hill. As was mentioned in previous articles, there was a very moving ceremony honoring those soldiers who fought in one of the bloodiest battles that led to the recapture of the Western Wall. Rabbi Nesson read the Prayer for Israel in Hebrew and Rebecca Gold read it in English. A troupe of Israeli children performed dances for us, and Shuli Nathan sang Jerusalem of Gold. It was a very moving ceremony and only added to how connected we all felt throughout the trip. Words cannot express how thankful I am that I had the opportunity to go on our Greater MetroWest Community Mission to celebrate Israel's 70th anniversary.

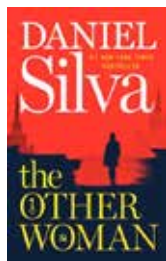
