

From our Administrator

WHAT'S HAPPENING... THOUGHTS FROM THE SYNAGOGUE ADMINISTRATOR



My hope for Morristown Jewish Community Beit Yisrael.

Contrary to popular belief, we Jews are in the redemption business. Our mission is to hasten the day when the world will be redeemed by justice, mercy and peace. The time is short

and the task grows ever more demanding. Even though we are explicit about our calling to pursue social justice, with tzedakah being one of the precepts we abide by, we seem to have lost confidence in our right to assert that Judaism **demands** something of us.

More often than not, the work of *tikkun olam*, repairing of our world, is relegated to a committee, rather than held as a central congregational imperative. At times it seems we've traded the "holiness track," with its attendant obligatory acts, for the "spirituality track," focused on religious feeling. Yet, what passes for "religious living" can become an exercise in selfabsorption, if we address G-d but not the human condition.

While I've had many important, even sacred moments, in the course of my Jewish Communal life, the closest I've come to a religious community, intent on creating staircases between heaven and Earth, was at Congregation B'nai Israel in Boca Raton, Florida. This Temple engages its members and shapes them. Its lesson, as taught by Rabbi Richard Agler, in partnership with its lay leadership, is that social justice and Judaism are inextricably bound; to be a committed Jew, one must work at altering the shape of the world so that it will comport more closely with the one we imagine G-d has in mind. Of course, to approach the "mind of G-d," we study endlessly. I envision that we, at MJCBY, can emulate and even surpass the wonderful work that CBI accomplishes each year.

One reason, I learned, is because there is a demanding quality about our institution. Jews now tend to speak of rabbis as facilitators and empowerers, but I see our Rabbi Nesson and our congregation as demanders, as ones who insist: "Jews Study!" and "Jews Act!" All one has to do is to come to our Shabbat service and listen as our Rabbi brings the voice of the Torah to life before your very eyes. I'm so proud to call him my colleague.

So how do we come to this place where we welcome and embrace congregants but then are reluctant to insist that they engage in religious actions, including prayer, study, and the work of social justice? G-d knows, we value our personal autonomy. We also value the power and possibility of community and communal responsibility. As for me, it is not the prospect of autonomy but the appeal of the collective that has kept me attached and committed. I dream of a synagogue that matters, that acknowledges its power to teach and transform, that creates Jewish potency out of Jewish potential. Our synagogue must exalt acts of kindness and social justice as sacred expressions. It needs to truly live each day within the tenets of Judaism...Torah, Avodah and Gemilut Chassidim. It tells Jews that to be a synagogue member is to face our G-d given obligations to reconstitute the world: both the world within the synagogue and the one that reaches beyond.

What I wish for, what I hope for, is that all of us at MJCBY accept the challenge. This call to righteousness. Let us heed Gd's call for us to be a blessing, for G-d has indeed commanded us to pursue social justice. Let's start today to formulate our plans as to how we can contribute to making social justice a year-long effort, a daily staple in our Jewish lives.




