FROM THE RELIGIOUS SCHOOL



at all - we fast - and 2020 can be seen as having even more fast days. While some may be more known and some less known, some more observed and some

less observed, all of these can be seen as having purpose and importance. What all of our fast days have in common is that observing them can help us appropriately enhance our focus and see more clearly.

Some traditionally fast when they are about to get married. 7 Adar is the Fast of Moshe - the day recognized as both when Moshe Rabeinu was born and 120 years later died. 13 Adar is Ta'anit Esther, the important Fast of Esther that comes the day before and poignantly leads into the Feast of Esther. 14 Nisan, the day before Pesach, is Ta'anit B'Chorot, the Fast of the First Born. 28 Ivar is Ta'anit Shmuel, the Fast for unifying together for GOoD on the Yahrtzeit of Shmuel HaNavi, 17 Tamuz is Shevah Asar b'Tamuz to remember and mourn the breaching of Jerusalem's city walls. 9 Av is Tisha b'Av to remember and mourn the destruction of The Temple. 3 Tishrei is Tzom Gedaliah to remember the assassination of our wise and righteous Governor Gedaliah. 10 Tishrei is Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, our ultimate day of trying to make right that which we had previously not done so right. 10 Tevet is Asara b'Tevet to remember and mourn the beginning of Nebuchadnezzar's siege of Jerusalem.

Asara b'Tevet will be upon us next on 7 January. While it is classified as a minor fast day, it may be seen as more major than other such days. Some will say that this day on which the siege of Jerusalem began is even more critical than the day on which the walls were breached and even than the day on which the Temple was destroyed.

Interesting it is that in this Year of Vision, 2020, we will actually have two Asara b'Tevets. Could that be especially poignant? Perhaps so. Certainly worthy of considering. Of course, we know that the Gregorian calendar is not our calendar, and it didn't even exist to us ages ago. Still, I think it fascinating that Asara b'Tevet will occur twice in this year of 2020, this special and potentially powerful Year of Vision. What can we learn from it? Let's be careful. Let's be smart. Let's be proactive. Let's not let others ultimately be able to destroy our "Temple" by potentially breaching our perimeter today.

or a people who so enjoy our food, we We will begin 2020 with fasting on Asara b'Tevet on January 7. sure do have a number of special days and end 2020 with fasting on Asara b'Tevet on December 25. Not throughout the year when we do not eat a usual occurrence. Not only that, but the second of these Asara b'Tevets will be particularly special falling on a Friday leading into Shabbat. We consider Shabbat so special that we do not want a fast day to interfere. Only Asara b'Tevet and Yom Kippur are allowed to coincide with Shabbat.

> Yom Kippur may be a more understandable exception. Yom Kippur is the holiest of all holy days, and back in 2017 it was that much more special with Yom Kippur being on Shabbat. In 2024, Yom Kippur will be on Shabbat again. We consider Shabbat to be so special that we might think that we should be able to eat and enjoy as it is Shabbat even though it is Yom Kippur. Yom Kippur is referred to as Shabbat Shabbaton - the Shabbat of Shabbats - and Yom Kippur does even trump Shabbat.

> As will be the case on Friday, December 25, 2020, we are even willing to give up for now some of the joy of Shabbat for the sake of countless better Shabbats in the future - it may be Shabbat, but we are still to honor Asara b'Tevet and fast until that holy day is over and enjoy a festive Shabbat meal after the Kiddush after the fast has concluded. A rarity it is to be allowed to go into Shabbat in fasting mode, but therefore there must be such profound lesson for us to glean from this.

> Asara b'Tevet is more than just not eating or drinking from dawn to sundown - more than the particular technicalities of observances - it should come down to feeling, to focus, and to intent. Some of us may add Aneinu to our Amidah. Some of us may add Avinu Malkenu to our services. Some of us may supplement with Selichot as well. All of this is GOoD, but I encourage us all to try and more clearly see where we are in our hearts and where we are in our minds with whatever we are doing.

> What a calendar we have before us - in this Year of Vision of 2020, maybe we will enable ourselves to and allow ourselves to see more clearly - Asara b'Tevet twice in the one year - and the second being on Shabbat - such an incredible opportunity for us to see more clearly for a better future. The past provides the lessons the present provides the opportunity - the future we do get to create. Let's use the present to learn from the past for the sake of a better future.





Anthony is an Honor Roll student at Black River Middle School in Chester,







