his is the first newsletter coming your way from our Morristown Jewish Center since March. I am grateful to Donna Gross for taking this on, as yet another

Right now, this summer of 2020, our world in New Jersey, secular and Jewish, begins to slowly and cautiously open, This is the way it should be. The Covid-19 virus is not something to take lightly. You don't need to tell me.



Religious School News - Notes From The Cantor



Dear 7th Grade graduating class,

Thave had so much fun teaching you quys this year.

I have been telling everyone, everywhere I go, that I have never had a class like you.

Seriously, everyone in my class at my rabbinic school has had to hear me go on and on about my brilliant 7th grade students all year -- the questions you ask, the insights you come up with, the creativity and enthusiasm with which you all approach every topic and every assignment. But it's not just that you're all incredibly smart -- like scary smart, every single one of you. It's not just that you're creative, enthusiastic, and talented -- and you are all that too, as you demonstrated not only in the Hanukkah play, and the Purim Shpiel, both of which were just the best, and in all of our group readings of the books of Genesis and Exodus.

What makes you really special is that you work not just as a class, but as a team that really pulls for each other in a way I have never seen 7th graders do. You guys, as a group, are really special in that you all truly saw and valued the gifts and skills each other has, and brought your full selves while making space and welcoming each other, every time we got together. It had nothing to do with me, you did it yourselves. It's so rare, and such a gift you gave each other and gave me.

It's funny that we call this "Religious School," because when people hear the word "religion" or "religious" they sometimes think they're being taught beliefs. The truth is, no one can teach you what to believe. Your teachers here, the Rabbi and I have tried to introduce you to the stories, traditions, language, and culture of your people and your heritage. We have only scratched the surface. There is so much more for you to discover, learn, and wrestle with about being Jewish, that you will continue to encounter throughout the rest of your lives. How you feel about all these things we've studied -- the Torah, Israel, history, traditions and holidays, life-cycle events, prayers, and God -- will continue to change throughout your lives, and that's a good thing. It should change. It should always be evolving and growing, as you do, and as your knowledge does. But what I want you to take away with you is the knowledge that we need you. When I say "we," I mean the Jewish community, including the Morristown Jewish Center -the people who think of this building as a second home, which I

hope all of you do too. Today is not goodbye. I fully expect to see every one to find a way and stay connected to this community. We need your voices, your knowledge, and your ideas. We need your prayer-leading and Torah reading skills. We need your abilities to teach, share, tell stories, solve problems, and see the best in others. You are valuable to this place, and you shape its future.

When I say "we need you," I also mean the larger Jewish community. At the beginning of this school year, we talked about what it means to be Jewish, and I want you to take away from that, is being Jewish means being part of a big extended family that stretches across the world. That family needs you. We need your creativity, your intelligence, your questions, and your challenges. You are incredibly valuable to the Jewish people, especially because of your unique abilities, as I described earlier, to see, appreciate, and bring out what is best in each other. As Jews, we all are given the monumental task of doing tikkun olam, repairing the world. That means facing the problems and challenges that you see in the world. So, when you look around and you notice the health care system in the United States is broken; when you hear protesting structural racism; or gender inequality; if you have ideas about what can be done about the problem of violence in public schools, or environmental damage caused by human activity. These are just a few examples of the problems in the world around us, that Jews all over the world consider our responsibility to work towards fixing. There are Jewish organizations addressing and wrestling with all these problems, because we know it is our responsibility to do so. It's your responsibility now too. This is what we mean when we talk about tikkun olam, and doing a mitzvah or tzedakah. These are the next steps that you will lead us towards, as the next generation of Jews who are inspired to do this work. It may sound like an huge task, which is why the Talmud teaches us: "You do not have to complete this task of repairing the world, but you are not free to stop doing it."

We are about to sing this piece from the Talmud as our closing to this commencement ceremony in just a moments. I want to add, that I have no doubt that every one of you is up to the task of doing that work of Tikkun Olam. Your dedication to bringing your all to everything you do, your incredible commitment to continue coming together as a group and doing real learning, even in the face of this very strange and frightening pandemic that has turned the world upside down for the past four months.
