### CARES

ave you ever contacted Jewish Famlily Service or visited a loved one at Daughters of Israel? If you answered YES, you have benefitted from one of JENNIFER WEINSTOCK Jewish Federation of Greater MetroWest

NJ partners that participates in CARES.

CARES is the department of Federation that forms a network with its eleven partners serving older adults and their families. It promotes collaboration and learns about community needs for planning purposes.

As a volunteer, I recently became the lay leader Chair of CARES and am thrilled to work alongside Sisterhood member Debbie Brody within this important department. CARES meets four times a year and also participates in professional development days, highlighting current topics such as the prevention of elder abuse. CARES partners provide a remarkably wide range of services, including wellness programs, caregiver support, Alzheimer's and dementia programs, housing, visits in seniors' homes from chaplains, educational programs, services for Holocaust survivors and more. CARES gives its constituent partners an opportunity to discuss and leverage resources on common topics, especially during this time of Covid. For example, because of what CARES learned from its partners, Federation launched volunteer programs last spring through which seniors may receive grocery deliveries, friendly phone calls and basic "tech support," such as help with Zoom and Facetime.

ne of the most remarkable things about MJCBY's Social Action programming activities is the range of ages of members who participate. I recall when Rookie Friedman and Jea-

nette Epstein, then both in their 80s, cooked franks & beans, meatloaf casseroles and brought them to serve our needy neighbors in the Soup Kitchen. This was in the days before the Department of Health ruled that food cooked at home could not be brought in. Before the pandemic closed the kitchen to volunteers, many who helped in the kitchen or stood on the serving line were in their 70s.

Now we have another age cohort – preschoolers – who are stepping up to the plate to help out. Every Friday, students in our Shalom Yeladim program drop their coins into the tzedakah box in the school. Michelle Nulman, our SY principal, decided that NourishNJ (the new name of the Community Soup Kitchen) would be an appropriate choice to receive this money. Michelle, her husband Carlos and their kids have all helped out at the Soup Kitchen. In all, the SY students donated \$312. What a beautiful gesture.

There has been a second act of kindness from the SY children. They have conducted a toy drive! A treasure trove of 20-30 new toys will be given to Family Promise (FP) of Morris County. FP is a homeless agency located in the Greystone Park area. MJCBY is proud to be a support congregation, under the direction of Keith Usiskin. Families that are housed in local churches, synagogues and mosques acting as host congregations: support congregations provide meals and spend an overnight, making sure that all are safe. Additionally, they interact with these sheltered families and play games and read to the children being housed.

The bottom line is that you can never be too old or too young to participate in our various mitzvah projects and activities.



In the wee hours of May 15, 1902, three thousand Jewish women quietly took up positions on the streets of Manhattan's Lower East Side. Convinced by the latest jump in the price of kosher meat that they were being gouged, they assembled in squads of five, intent on shutting down every kosher butcher shop in New York's Jewish quarter.






