Presidents' Message





KATHY NEIBART COUNTING UP OUR DAYS

Most people, in anticipation of a special moment, count down to that celebration. We count down the days until a birthday, bar/bat mitzvah, wedding, vacation, or days until camp begins. It is a typical practice to count down to something. I even have an app on my phone - Days Until - that counts down to each of these special events. My family used it to count down the days until camp began or our family trip to Israel.

&

As we come to the end of Pesach, we begin counting in a different way. We count *up* toward Shavuot and the celebration of receiving the Torah. During this time we count *up*, as we count the Omer, in preparation for receiving something very special. G-d waited 50 days following our freedom from slavery in Egypt to present the Torah. He knew that the Jewish people needed time to process their experience in slavery and prepare to receive something special. We count *up* to that special day when we can celebrate. We look forward, counting *up*, in anticipation and preparation for this special day.

For the past year, we too have been counting. Counting the days, weeks and months at home, without any firm end point. With the hope of more people receiving vaccinations, we are counting ahead with greater goals in mind. We can count 2 weeks beyond our vaccinations to being together again with friends and loved ones who have also been vaccinated. For many, this will be a process of preparing themselves for what it will feel like to physically come back together in proximity to others. After being physically separated, the idea of gathering with others is going to take time to consider and be comfortable, progressing slowly, one step, one day at a time, counting *up* until the days are more typical.

Take a moment to use this time to reflect on where we have been over the past year and begin to count *up* toward better days, celebrations together and of course, the celebration of Shavuot. Let's count *up* those days, as we do each year, and know that this year we are counting *up* towards a time in which we will be able to come together in person once again in our community. Looking forward to seeing everyone soon at one of our outdoor Shabbat services or holiday events.

WHAT IS GEMILUT HASADIM?

The Gemilut Hasadim Committee is here to help support you and your family. We provide assistance to our MJCBY families who are experiencing illness, recovering from surgery or need help at a difficult time. We provide meals to help comfort them and lessen one burden of needing to cook during these times.

We are looking for volunteers to make an occasional meal for a MJCBY member who is in need.

As we discussed in last month's Bulletin, we are preparing Rise & Shine Breakfast Bags for Nourish. NJ clients and neighborhood school children who stop by the facility on Sussex Av-

enue. Each bag includes a box of cereal, shelf-safe milk (no need to refrigerate), a container of juice, a granola bar and a cup of fruit along with a spoon and napkin. Our goal is to provide 100 bags each month until environmental factors allow us to once again do our 4th Sunday of the month regular volunteer stints.

The Captains, Carol Leiwant, Flo Sager, Rita Fand, Howard Buxbaum, David Ticker and I believe that buying in bulk from a warehouse store (e.g., Costco or WalMart online) will enable us to achieve a low cost of about \$2.25 per bag. At the present time, we think the best way for the congregation to help us is by donating to the MJCBY Soup Kitchen fund. This can be done in conjunction with the observance of a Yahrzeit or to mark a special occasion. (A gift of \$36 will fund 16 bags, \$54 will cover 24 bags, \$72 will provide for 32, and so forth.) We hope you will consider a contribution.

The MJCBY administrative staff has been diligent in alerting me to donations to this fund when they come in, so we can put your donation to good use right away.
