Presidents' Message

It is traditional on Shavuot to read the **Book of Ruth**. There are many different reasons given by scholars about why we read this story on this particular holiday. We would like to focus today on one of the key themes noted in *Megillat Ruth*, that of loving kindness, *chesed*.

Loving kindness stands at the center of the story of Ruth. The Book of Ruth has the word *chesed* noted three times in the Megillah - this seems noteworthy. There is a mutual caring and loving kindness between Ruth and her mother-in-law Naomi, after the loss of their spouses. There is also a caring demonstrated between Ruth and Boaz, an Israelite farmer, who allowed her to take food from his land. Ruth and Boaz ultimately married and King David was to become one of their descendents.

It seems that every person mentioned in the Book of Ruth demonstrates some manner of chesed, whether in spirit or actual acts of loving kindness. The story of Ruth is still relevant and timely for 2021, reminding us all that there are many people doing good in the world. We like to view the actions of others with good intent, that their ultimate goal is to do good for others, having the spirit of chesed, even if the actions may not be interpreted as such. We like to presume the good intent in people.

As we begin to emerge from our winter hibernation and COVID closures, let's remember to take the time to presume good in others. Pause and think about how we can be a help to those who are struggling. Reflect on our own language and actions, being more aware of how they may be perceived by others. Welcome and celebrate *Shavuot* with the intent of ultimately showing chesed toward others.

We hosted some very special programs in the month of April!

Dr. Tova Friedman, who is one of only 5 child survivors from her native Polish town that was once home to thousands

of Jewish children, spoke to us in honor of Yom Hashoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day. Over 100 zoom screens were tuned in as Dr. Friedman shared her harrowing experience, which includes Auschwitz at age 5. Dr. Friedman's story is not only a reminder of the atrocities of the Holocaust, but even more importantly, her incredible resilience and life in the face of it all are an inspiration to all of us! If you missed Dr. Friedman's talk, you can listen to it on our website and/ or youtube channel.

For Yom Hazikaron, Israel's Memorial Day, we were joined by Dan Almagor who shared his story of the famous Tel Saki battle, including never before seen footage from his personal archive. The Tel Saki story was recently aired on HBO Max as part of the series 'Valley Of Tears'. After Dan survived Tel Saki and the Yom Kippur war, Dan moved to the United States where he had a very successful career. However, he never forgot the vows he made to his fallen friends that they would not be forgotten. As part of the program we honored Dan's 32 unforgettable friends, as 32 MJCBY members and friends lit a candle and said the names of the fallen Tel Saki heroes.

Following these two somber days, we celebrated Yom Ha'atzmaut, Israel's Independence Day, with a fun and educational scavenger hunt organized by the Federation of Greater MetroWest. MJCBY served as one of 5 Morris County stops as more than 60 families received boxes filled with Israeli goodies and prizes, and drove from stop to stop to gather the clues. The rain did not deter our participants. It turned out to be the perfect in-car rainy day family activity!



RELIGIOUS SCHOOL IS BACK IN ACTION FOLLOWING OUR PESACH BREAK!

This month we were busy learning about Yom Hashoah, Holocaust Memorial Day (for the older grades), Yom

Hazikaron, Israel's Memorial Day, and Yom Ha'atzmaut, Israel's Independence Day.

Our older grades explored the significance and connection of all three of these dates. It was in the aftermath of the Holocaust that the state of Israel was born. The echoes of 'Never again!' reverberated in the minds of the young Israeli warriors who fought with everything they had, to ensure that the Jewish people would finally have a country to call their own, a safe place that would be there for Jews around the world whenever they wished (or needed) to come 'home'. Becoming a state, and being able to call Israel 'home' for Jews worldwide, came with many sacrifices. It is those sacrifices we commemorate on Yom Hazikaron, and it is the ensuing freedom that we celebrate a day later with Yom Ha'atzmaut.

Our entire Religious School gathered (via zoom and in person) to learn the songs pertaining to each day during Cantor Shana's music class. For Yom Ha'atzmaut we were all dressed in blue and white, the colors of the Israeli flag, and our students were greeted by an 'Israel welcoming committee' with the Israeli flag and Israeli music setting the tone for the day.

Our 6th grade students and their parents participated in an online B'nai Mitzvah Retreat, led by Rabbi Nesson and Miriam. Parents and students explored the meaning and significance of the Bar/Bat Mitzvah together with a number of interactive activities. As a group, they began the journey toward their upcoming special day by discussing Mitzvah project options (students), and reviewing the details surrounding becoming B'nai Mitzvah at MJCBY (parents).

Please join us on May 2nd (rain date on May 23) for an exciting open house at Freedom Park! There will be fun and educational activities for all ages, safely distanced at 6 ft. apart, led by our staff. There will be Israeli dancing for adults, pre packaged snacks, giveaways, and so much more. Don't miss this exciting event, and please spread the word far and wide!
