t the MJCBY Board of Directors meeting last month, we participated in an exercise together. We asked the members of the board to complete this prompt, "I Care About Being Involved in the MJCBY Community Because..." We wanted our board to have the opportunity to reflect on why we do what we do to support our MJCBY community. Sometimes it's important to take a step back to reflect on our accomplishments and take time to look ahead at what's yet to come.

We wanted to share a few of the responses of our board members:

- I want a vibrant place for my family (especially my children) to feel accepted and welcome.
- There is a long history that our congregation has had in the area and I do not want to see it disappear. One has to stay engaged in the community - there are many small tasks as well as larger ones one can take on or volunteer for.





Blood drive guidelines:

- 16 year olds must have signed New Jersey Blood Services Parental Consent Form
- Eat a good meal, drink plenty of water & bring photo ID
- Appointments are strongly recommended (but not required) to keep donors spaced out. Walk ins will be taken.
- All staff & donors will be required to wear a face covering at the blood drive.
- Anyone entering the blood drive will be prescreened (temp taken, travel questions, basic health questions).
- Canteen items are individually packaged and will be brought to the donor by a staff member.
- All stations will be wiped down after the donor leaves the area (registration, medical history, donation bed, canteen area). The blood center will provide sanitizing wipes and gloves.
- Some criteria changes have been made including malarial country deferral time reduced from 1 year to 3 months, donors living in UK in the past are able to donate now, tattoo/piercing changes, etc. Some updates can be found here: https://www.nybc.org/donate-blood/become-donor/can-i-donate-blood/

Mat an exciting month we had at Religious School!

While we normally do not give much credence to Halloween, we seized the opportunity to teach a fascinating Jewish story about the Golem - a clay creature that was created by Rabbi Yehuda

Loew (the 'Maharal') of Prague in the 1500's. The Golem's job was to protect the Jewish people from antisemitic attacks and progroms. Our 6th and 7th grade students reenacted the story to our younger students, as we were introduced to the persona of the 'Maharal', and learned new vocabulary words like 'Kabalah' and 'Genizah'.

In preparation for Hanukkah, our students were visited, via zoom, by Judge Keith Freedman from Rochester, NY, who runs the 'Jewish Soldiers Project'. Judge Freedman speaks to Jewish students all over the country and collects letters and care packages that he then sends to Jewish soldiers stationed all over the world. Our students were able to ask him questions about this wonderful mitzvah opportunity and heard about some of the exciting and often remote places our packages might make it to: Iraq, rural Africa, all over Europe and more. Many thanks to all the students and families who participated in writing cards and sending in treats and goodies to brighten the soldier's Hanukkah!

We are excited to participate in the annual MJCBY Hanukkah celebration on the Morristown Green, and hope the entire congregation joins us to hear our wonderful students sing Hanukkah songs! 




