January was a busy month that included:


- A fun afternoon of Family Ice skating at Mennen arena hosted by Kadima 6th-8th graders.

- Israeli dancing to chase away the winter blues, led by Reut Segall!


February might continue with freezing temperatures, but our programming will help us all feel warm inside!


Thankfully we are now back in the building, and our classrooms and hallways are once again filled with the sounds of in-person learning!






