FROM THE RABBI'S DESK



The Last Word

For the past 35 years I have been writing an article every month (well, almost every month) in our congregation Newsletter. Over the years, this Newsletter has had many different titles, different editors, different layouts and different formats. Now it exists for many of us in cyber space only. I, for one, prefer it to be something in my hands, to hold and grasp. There is something about having a 'hard copy'. But I digress.

After 400 or so monthly articles, this is my final one. The Last Word.

By itself that makes this article bittersweet. It's still hard for me to grasp the end of 35 years as your Rabbi and Teacher at MJCBY.

I have been privileged to be part of your lives- part of your lives personally. You have invited me into your lives at the most precious moments, your happiest Simchas, from birth to Brit Milah to baby naming, and your most difficult and sad moments, in hospital rooms and standing with you at the edge of Olam Habah. You became B'Nai Mitzvah at 12 and 13 years old, and others became adult B'Nai Mitzvah while others still became new members of the Jewish community in conversion classes.

For all this and so much more, I am thankful and grateful for our MJCBY family and the years we have spent together.

So, what should the last words be?

Through the years there are certain things about which I have been passionate and about which I will remain passionate. These are the things about which I have written all along.

I am passionate about being Jewish.

I am passionate about being a teacher and speaker.

I am passionate about Israel.

I am passionate about this Jewish community and the Jewish community around the world.

I am passionate about bringing people into the beauty of Judaism.

I concluded my farewell talk to our congregation with these thoughts, which I share again with you now.

"It is said that every Rabbi has only one sermon. They just keep saying it in different words each week."

Well, here is the message - or two or three- that I have tried to teach every week-

First- BE JEWISH. BE PROUDLY JEWISH.

Right now, with anti-Semitism on the rise, the most important responsibility you have - all of you - all of us - is to be publicly and proudly Jewish. This includes LOVING and supporting ISRAEL.

Second- LOVE THIS CONGREGATION.

This MJCBY has been my home for 35 years. It is the place that I raised my family and dedicated my energy. I hope each of you knows how special this place is. So, make it a priority in your life.

And third- BE KIND, BE KIND, BE KIND

In our world still trying to come out of the Covid fog, let's remember to be kind to one another and be patient with one other.

Then I ended with a song, to the tune of *So Long Farewell*, from *The Sound of Music*.

*So long, farewell, it's time to say good-bye
Good-bye, Good-bye to MJCBY*

*So long...
Farewell...
Shalom...
Shalom*

And this, my friends, is the very last word.

CANTOR'S NOTES



Rosh Chodesh

Cantor Shana

Eleven times a year, we interrupt our Shabbat morning Torah service to make a special announcement: Rosh Chodesh, the first day of the new month according to the Hebrew calendar, will happen on a particular day in the coming week. The congregation stands to hear the announcement, and a congregant is given the honor to hold the Torah as the blessing *Birkat HaChodesh* is chanted. If there is a holiday in the coming month, a snippet of the music of that holiday might be worked into the text to give us a little taste of it.

I love this moment each month. It feels like a tiny moment of Rosh Hashanah, when we re-assess our lives, remind ourselves of what is most meaningful in our days, and ask for divine help to live in the best possible ways we can. The text itself boils down our needs into a basic request: "Grant us a long peaceful life, with goodness and blessing, sustenance and health, abundance and honor, free from shame and reproach, guided by the love of Torah, in which our worthy aspirations will be fulfilled." What more could we ask for?

The text goes on to acknowledge the miracle of the redemption from slavery our people have already received, and request that we be gathered together from the four corners of the earth, before announcing the name of the coming month and the day of the week on which it will fall. You may have noticed that I said this only happens eleven times a year, and that's because we will not announce the new month of Tishrei -- the assumption is that everyone knows when Rosh Hashanah itself is approaching; we spend the entire month of Elul preparing for that momentous occasion, so we don't need to announce it the Shabbat before it arrives.

So may we all enjoy a new month of blessing, health, and growth, as individuals, as families, and as a community. To those who are facing a month containing challenge, loss, and difficulties, may they be carried and supported by those in their community until a time when joy and strength find them again. I wish you all a טוב חודש, a good month!

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Thank You, Rabbi Nesson, for 35 years of extraordinary leadership!

The following is adapted from my remarks at Rabbi Nesson's celebratory retirement luncheon on May 7, 2023:

Whenever I stand up to speak at MJCBBY, I always have a long list of thank you's to recite. You would think I confused shul for the Academy Awards sometimes.

The reason I always have so many people to thank is because this place would not function – it certainly would not be as amazing as it is – if it were not for so many incredible volunteers and dedicated staff. In fact, often the best thing I do as President is pick the right people for the right jobs, let them do their jobs, and then . . . take credit for their work.

I definitely picked right when I asked Amy Brunswick and Linda Prentiss to chair the Rabbi Celebration Committee. I cannot tell you how many hours they put into the most minute details about this weekend, making sure every aspect of the celebration was worthy of this congregation and of our guest of honor. They have exceeded all expectations and done an extraordinary job. Thank you, Amy and Linda.

And they picked a wonderful committee to help: Cantor Maimon Attias, Dorothy Cohen, Peppi Glass, Paula Gottesman, Gerry Gross, Kathy Neibart, Harriet Sakofs, and Fern Spitzer. Thank you to the committee.

Special thanks to Fern as our Facilities Chair, who has been very busy in recent weeks making sure the front steps, railings, doors, sign in the front of the building, and other parts of our historic facility were in good shape and ready for the weekend's festivities. Special thanks also to Alexis McGrath, our Security Chair, for making sure we would be safe and secure in the building, developing detailed protocols and coordinating with our security guard company and local law enforcement. Thank you to our volunteers manning both the front and back doors throughout the weekend, and to Judy Diringier for coordinating that effort. Thank you to Robert Berns, Paul Green, Mark Levine, Ilan Onigman, and Lew Stone for their help with technology throughout the weekend. And thanks, as always to our

staff – Amy Stover, Michael Roberts, Rockey Cornell, Isaiah Ward, and Marco Tello – for all their support for the weekend's events.

Thank you to our special guest rabbi for the weekend, Rabbi Richard Eisenberg, for being here and for your words of wisdom on Friday night and Saturday morning. Thank you also to the other guest clergy joining us today. Assemblywoman Aura Dunn, thank you for being here. Thank you to Rabbi Nesson's family for joining us this weekend and making this event extra special for him. And of course, thank you to Rabbi Nesson, for giving us a reason to be here today. We could have just stayed home and watched King Charles's coronation festivities on TV. After all, the last coronation in the United Kingdom was 70 years ago. Rabbi Nesson has only been here for 35 years, so clearly this is not as big a deal.

There are some interesting parallels between the events this weekend in London and what we have going on here in Morristown. King Charles asked that the focus of the coronation weekend be on service to others. That sort of sums up Rabbi Nesson's tenure here. 35 years of service and dedication to this synagogue, the members of this congregation, and the broader community. Rabbi, thank you for that.

And while the coronation included elements that have continued since the coronation of William the Conqueror in 1066, King Charles put some unique touches on the ceremony. I think that's the Conservative Jewish approach to doing things – don't throw out tradition but reinterpret where necessary and refine it. And that's what Rabbi Nesson has done here, keeping this place relevant in the 21st century, and able to be meaningful to multiple generations.

Speaking of multiple generations, Rabbi, you taught multiple generations that have come through our synagogue. You helped teach our youngest children by

being instrumental in the creation of Shalom Yeladim, our early childhood education center, one of the warmest and loving places for young children you will ever find. Thank you on behalf of so many children who have gone through Shalom Yeladim over the years and have been made better for the experience.

Thank you on behalf of the grown-ups for teaching us and inspiring us each week, and especially on the High Holidays and at yizkors throughout the years, with your incredibly insightful and meaningful, and often entertaining, sermons. Anyone who thinks a d'var Torah is inevitably boring and lifeless clearly has not spent time in the pews of MJCBY in the last 35 years. I sometimes find myself quoting lines from your sermons, and I am sure I am not alone in that.

You taught us – through many sermons, but also through your own personal experience in recent years with COVID – to cherish life. It does not last forever. Rather, life is a precious gift that we should never take

for granted. And life is never perfect. I remember, for instance, you once said that if you don't know a person's struggles, you don't really know the person. I think about that a lot, especially as we are constantly bombarded by online pictures of everyone's perfect lives, while we are dealing with our own struggles. But the online pictures are just a piece of reality. Life is always more complex. And the way we best deal with that complexity is through community. By being there for one another – to listen, to lend support. To comfort one another, sometimes even cook for one another. To pray together, to play together. To be together. You taught us the importance of community, and you helped foster and maintain a wonderful Jewish community here in Morristown. And for that, we are so grateful.

So, thank you, Rabbi Nesson, for 35 years of extraordinary leadership. We wish you many years of good health and good times ahead. L'chaim!

There are times during the year when our programming is exceptionally busy, as we celebrate a particular holiday.
