FROM THE RABBI'S DESK



Joy in a Time of Trouble

As we transition into the rhythms of summer, the days and months since October 7th have felt more layered, complex, and fraught. It certainly feels like we are in the wilderness. And yet, during this difficult moment, we have come together as a community in powerful and profound ways. This past June was one of our busiest and most successful months of programming and communal celebrations this past year.

June is usually a rather slow month, as school is out, and our summer plans are beginning. Aside from Shavuot, there are no major holidays or festivals. And yet, June was one of the busiest months of our calendar year.

On Shabbat morning, June 1st, we came together as a community to honor our beloved longtime leader and friend Gerry Lahn z"l with a Memorial Plaque on our "Western Wall." The following Sunday, we extended our community spirit and joined alongside our greater MetroWest community, traveling to NYC, where we marched alongside thousands at the Israel Parade.

On a joyous Friday evening, June 7th, we gathered to celebrate Pride Shabbat and were inspired by the words of Torah and wisdom from Ali Cohen and Arlyn Rayfield. Then Sunday morning, our Sisterhood came together for our annual Torah Fund Brunch, celebrating 85 years of Sisterhood and a tribute to Hillary Spain Reilly for her leadership and tireless commitment to Sisterhood.

On Tuesday night, June 11th, we joined our neighbors and friends from TBO and CBH to bring in Shavuot with our annual night of tefillah, tasty cheesecake, and Torah learning. We continued the learning the following evening as we gathered to explore some of Judaism's central texts around conversion. Shavuot is often considered a holiday of converts, as the giving of the Torah was a conversion process between the enslaved Israelites who left Egypt. From our tradition, we hold that all the souls of those who choose to be chosen also stood at Sinai.

That Friday, we celebrated our longtime and beloved friend Sid Levit's 100th birthday and dedicated a second plaque on our "Western Wall" in his honor. The next morning, we called our friend and community member Vivian London to the Torah for her Bat Mitzvah and, only a week later, called our very own Alex Milan to the Torah for her Bat Mitzvah.

On the last Friday of the month, we welcomed our College and Graduate students with a special Shabbat Service and Dinner. The next morning, we came together for the Aufruf of Asher Weinstein and Stephanie Fleischer in anticipation of their wedding on June 30th!

In this moment of darkness, the way through the wilderness is by coming together, for there is no way of getting through without joining together and marching.

May we continue to come together to celebrate the moments of joy and celebration as we uplift and proclaim a place for everyone here at MJCBY.


